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Content Internationalization

Global Perspectives

Assessment Practices

Global Competency Rubrics

Develop rubrics that explicitly outline the criteria for assessing global competencies, such as intercultural communication, adaptability, and collaboration. Provide clear expectations and feedback on these skills.

Cross-Cultural Group Projects

Assign group projects that require collaboration among students from different cultural backgrounds. Assess both the final product and the process, looking at how well students navigated cultural differences within their teams.

International Case Study Analysis

Include assessments where students analyze international case studies. Evaluate their ability to understand and apply concepts in diverse cultural contexts, and encourage critical thinking about global issues.

Multilingual Assessments

Offer assessments in multiple languages or allow students to choose the language in which they are most comfortable expressing themselves. This recognizes and supports linguistic diversity.

Reflective Journals or Blogs

Introduce reflective assessments, such as journals or blogs, where students document their thoughts on cultural experiences, international perspectives gained, and personal growth throughout the course.

Global Issue Research Papers

Assign research papers on global issues, requiring students to investigate and present solutions to problems from various cultural perspectives. Assess their ability to synthesize information and propose culturally sensitive solutions.

Intercultural Communication Exercises

Design assessments that evaluate students' intercultural communication skills. This could involve role-playing scenarios, simulated cross-cultural negotiations, or oral presentations on culturally sensitive topics.

Language Proficiency Assessments

Assess language proficiency in relevant languages, ensuring that language skills are an integral part of the evaluation process. This can be done through written assignments, presentations, or language proficiency exams.

Virtual International Collaborations

Evaluate participation in virtual international collaborations. Assess how well students engage with peers from different countries, contribute to discussions, and navigate cultural differences in a digital environment.



Global Issue Debates

Organize debates on global topics, requiring students to take on different cultural perspectives. Assess their ability to articulate and defend viewpoints different from their own.

Portfolio Assessment

Implement portfolio assessments where students compile a collection of their work throughout the course. This can include reflections, projects, and assignments that demonstrate their global understanding and skills.

Assessment of International Experiences

If applicable, assess students who participate in study abroad programs, internships, or international experiences. Evaluate their ability to apply classroom knowledge to real-world cross-cultural situations.

Peer Assessment and Feedback

Integrate peer assessment components, where students evaluate each other's contributions to group projects or presentations, fostering a collaborative and inclusive learning environment.

Global Perspectives in Exams

Ensure that exams include questions that require students to apply their knowledge in a global context. This could involve analyzing global trends, historical events, or contemporary issues.

Assessment Training for Faculty

Provide training for faculty on how to effectively assess global competencies. This can include workshops, resources, and peer collaboration to share best practices.



Extra-Curricular Activities

International Student Clubs
