INTRODUCTION TO NEP ALLIGNED PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

SVS has taken the initiative to restructure programmes and inculcate key features as per the guidelines of NEP 2020 and approved by AICTE/UGC. The Programme Curriculum for BSc. Psychology consists of the following:

- 1. Programme Core Courses (PCC) and Elective Courses (PEC): The set of Courses which prepares students in Major discipline of the Programme (Ref: Table 1 & 2).
- 2. Multidisciplinary Minors (MDM): The Minors to choose from multidisciplinary area to add value to Core Programme and thus enhance employability & Entrepreneurship. Minor nomenclature would be added on to title of the degree along with Major (Ref: Table 3)
- 3. Open Electives/Generic Electives (OE/GE): The multiple baskets of Courses to choose from multidisciplinary area to impart knowledge & Skills beyond core domain area of study (Ref: Table 4)-
- 4. Vocational and Skill Enhancement Courses (VSEC): To empower students with additional skills and thus make them industry ready (Ref: Table 5).
- 5. Multidisciplinary Holistic Development Courses (MDHDC): School of Holistic Development of the University offer Ability Enhancement Skills (AEC), Indian knowledge Systems (IKS), Value Education Courses, Professional Ethics & Life Skills Courses (VAC/VEC/EVLSC) to nurture holistic development of individual students (Ref: Table 6)-
- 6. Experiential Learning Course: To provide students with experiential learning process through Internship and projects with exposure to Industry Practices. (Ref: Table 7)

The following document presents a tabular and graphical summary of the course wise and semester wise credit distribution.

The Flow Diagram navigates students to various Types and Baskets of Courses Reference Table No, are given against each Type of Courses in the Flow diagram for students to refer and know Course Titles & Credits assigned. Every Student will earn the credits pertaining to various courses only when he/she fulfils all the academic requirements including prescribed Assessment. After earning the required credits specified for the Programme, the student is awarded BSc (Hons) degree in Major with Minor in chosen subject. It also provides information about the various exit options available to students.

In addition to this, the key features incorporated into the programmes available at Department of Vedic Sciences is given.





Course Type and Credit Distribution in BSc. Psychology (Hons.)


Pie Chart








NEP Implementation Flowchart Semester-wise Credit Distribution and Exit Options




