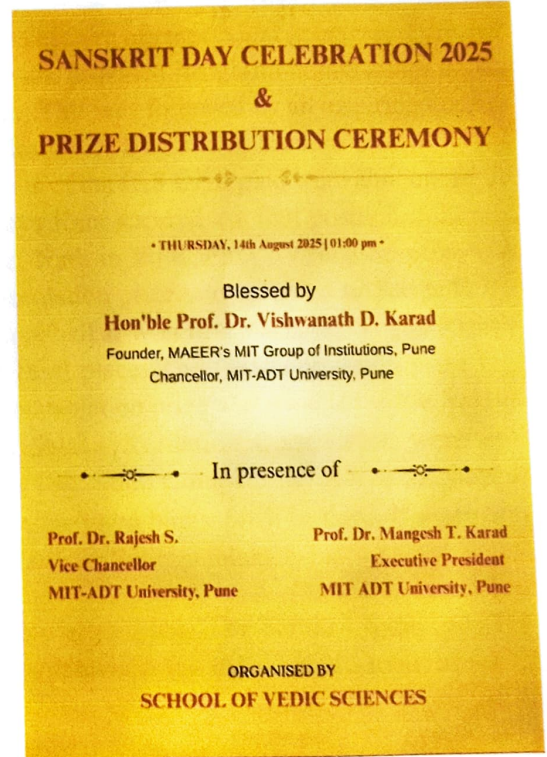
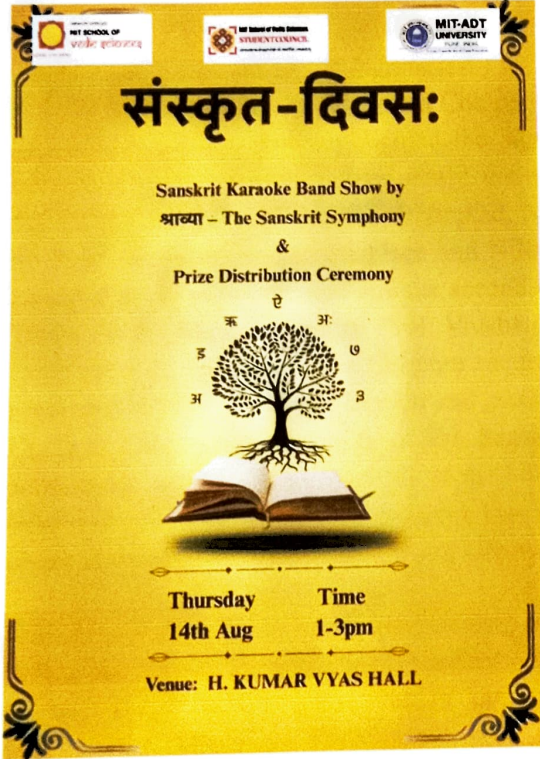


## Report Sanskrit Day Celebration

Sanskrit Day was celebrated with great reverence and enthusiasm at MIT ADT University. This report summarizes the Sanskrit Day celebration conducted by the School of Vedic Sciences on 14th August 2025. The event aimed to honor the timeless legacy of Sanskrit—a classical language that encapsulates the vast wisdom of ancient Indian literature and philosophy. The celebration served as a platform to engage both students, faculty and individuals from both Vedic and non-Vedic backgrounds through interactive formats like the

IKS Olympiad, Shloka recitation, and cultural showcases, making the language more accessible and enjoyable.

The event was graced by several distinguished guests, including Prof. S. Rajesh, Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of the University; Dr. Priya Singh, Respected Dean; Dr. Madhavi Godbole, Principal of the School of Vedic Sciences; Mr. Shrihari Gokarnkar, Founder of the 'Sanskritshree' Institution and Hon'ble Prof. Dr. Sunita Karad, Executive Director, MIT ADT University. The programme commenced with a traditional lamp-lighting ceremony, symbolizing the dispelling of ignorance and the illumination of knowledge. This sacred ritual was performed by the dignitaries and followed by a soulful *Mangalacharana* recited by students, setting a spiritually uplifting tone for the day.

Dr. Madhavi Godbole delivered the welcome address, extending heartfelt gratitude to all attendees. She emphasized the importance of Sanskrit in preserving India's cultural heritage and its role in shaping intellectual traditions. As a gesture of respect and appreciation, Tulasi plants were presented to the dignitaries. Prof. Pratik provided insightful commentary on the IKS Olympiad and Shloka Recitation Competition. This was followed by an inspiring address by Prof. S. Rajesh, who highlighted the significance of Sanskrit in modern academic and interdisciplinary research. Subsequently, the results of the IKS Olympiad were announced. In the student category of the IKS Olympiad, Manya Kaur secured the first position, followed by Sejal Gawande in second place and Niluthal Nath in third. First consolation prize was awarded to Soumya Agarwal and the second consolation prize was awarded to Saripella Sai Trisha. In the teacher category, Prof. Vrushali Kondhalkar won first place, Dr. Yogita Ranade came second, and Prof. Ekta Shirpure secured third place. The first consolation prize was presented to Prof. Shubhan Sherekar and second consolation prize was awarded to Dr. Yamini Upalkar. Later on, the results of the Sanskrit Shloka Recitation Competition were also announced. In the student category of the Shloka Recitation Competition, Aarya Salgaonkar won first place, followed by Tanushree Das in second and Nirav Shah in third. Consolation prizes were awarded to Sanjeevani and Dhanya Harihara Subramaniam.

The cultural segment featured a captivating performance titled "The Sanskrit Symphony" by the troupe of the organization "Sanskrit Shri", renowned for their artistic translations of regional songs from Marathi, Telugu and other languages, into Sanskrit. The organization founded by Shri Hari Gokarnkar, included appearances by Shri Pranjal Akkalkotkar (Co-Director), Smt. Shravani Wagle (Winner of Sur Nava Dhyas Nava), and Smt. Sanika Joshi (Television actress and singer).

The event concluded with a heartfelt vote of thanks delivered by the Student Council Representatives, expressing gratitude to all dignitaries, performers, participants, and attendees for making the celebration a grand success.
