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1. ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

1.1 Genesis and Evolution

Rev. Prof. Dr. Vishwanath D. Karad, a visionary figurehead, formed a group of institutions. It was established with the goals of delivering top-notch education and sparking a social revolution. The MAEER group, which was founded to support Maharashtra's higher education institutions and provide students additional platforms to fulfil global demands, has a similar attitude to MIT ADT University. Early in the 1980s, committed academics and social thinkers established the Maharashtra Academy of Engineering Educational and Research (MAEER) trust. On May 1, 1983, MAEER presented the first private engineering college, known as MIT, to the city of Pune. The MIT Group has built a reputation as the most reputable brand of higher education in engineering, science and technology, medicine, and a variety of other subjects from its modest beginnings of teaching a small number of students in two classrooms in 1983. With more than ten campuses in Maharashtra spread across thousands of acres of land, more than 70,000 students, and more than 84 institutions by 2015, the MIT Group had expanded into a sea of higher education. The institution has been expanding rapidly.

1.2 Profile of the University

The MIT Educational Group created history in 2016 when it opened the doors of its first institution on the breathtaking Vishwaraj Baug campus in Loni Kalbhor. The business acquired property that belonged to the late Indian actor Shri Raj Kapoorji in 2001. His tireless work enabled Rev. The University Grant Commission (UGC), New Delhi has recognised the MIT Art, Design and Technology University, Pune vide its letter No. F-8-33/2015 (CPP-1/PU), dated 10th November 2016 and University is empowered to issue the degrees specified in Section 22 of University Grants Commission Act, 1956.

The MIT ADT University is approved by Maharashtra state Government, the Gazette published on the 21st of August 2015.

The MIT ADT University is situated at Loni Kalbhor, Pune, and it is spread over 85 acres of land on the banks of Mula- Mutha river. It is a lush green campus with state-of-the-art facilities.

The university, which has 17 constituent Schools, offers intensive undergraduate, postgraduate, and doctoral programmes in Engineering, Fine Arts, Design,

Management, Marine Engineering, Bioscience Engineering, Food Technology, Film and Theatre, Drama, Music, Broadcasting and Journalism, Humanities, Holistic Development, Education and more. The University now has more than 12000 students enrolled, and that number is growing regularly. MIT ADT University is a perfect example of how entrepreneurship, innovation, and creativity can coexist. 5. GENERAL ADMISSION GUIDELINES REGARDING EWS, NRI, OCI, & LATERAL ENTRY

5.1 Admissions under Economically Weaker Sections (EWS):

As per the provisions made by the Government of Maharashtra (Resolution No. - 4019/.31/16-, dated 12th February 2019) 10% seats shall be reserved for Economically Weaker Section (EWS) candidates. **These 10% seats shall be over & above the sanctioned intake for the respective course.**

As per the provision of Government of Maharashtra GR Misc-2022/ pk.91/vishi-4, dt 22.06.2023, **as per the merit 50% Concession in Programme fees/ Scholarship will be given to the 10% of admitted students, belonging to Economically Weaker Section in the respective programme/course.**

The Institute shall ensure that 10% of reservation for Economically Weaker Section (EWS) as per the reservation policy for admission, without affecting the reservation percentage of SC/ST/OBC/General.

NOTE: EWS vacant seats shall be considered for the lateral entry to Second Year Course(s) with the same reservation policy for admission.

5.2 Introduction/ Continuation of Seats for Non-Resident Indian(s):

Five percent (5%) of seats within the “Approved Intake” shall be allowed for admission under NRI category.

Competent Authority for admission shall prepare a merit list of Applicants by inviting applications from eligible NRI students and admit strictly on merit basis.

In the event of non-availability of students in NRI seats, the seats shall be given to general candidates as per merit.

5.3 Introduction/Continuation of Supernumerary Seats for Foreign Nationals/Overseas Citizen of India (OCI)/Children of Indian Workers in Gulf Countries:

Fifteen percent (15%) supernumerary seats over and above the “Approved Intake” per Course shall be approved for AICTE approved Institutions and University Departments, for admitting students from Foreign Nationals/ Overseas Citizen of India/ Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries. One third (1/3) of these 15% seats shall be reserved for the Children of Indian Workers in the Gulf Countries.

5.4 Lateral Entry to Second Year Undergraduate Degree Course(s):

Lateral Entry to Second Year Undergraduate Degree Course(s) shall be permissible up to a maximum of 10% of the “Approved Intake” which shall be over and above, (supernumerary) of the “Approved Intake”, plus the unfilled vacancies of the First year.

Vacant seats arising out of the students withdrawing the admission in the First Year shall also be considered for Lateral Entry.

Important Notes:

1. If any candidate submits a duplicate leaving / transfer certificate, statement of marks, or any other document then the candidate must give a notarized affidavit on stamp paper of Rs.100/- in the prescribed form attached as Annexure 2.
2. In case the name of the student is changed for any reason, the candidate must submit a Government Gazette notification to that effect.
3. Anti-ragging form by student and parent – must be filled up online and submitted on www.antiragging.in every year.
4. Concerned Schools/Institutes are required to submit Transfer / Leaving Certificate, Migration Certificate, and all affidavits, if any, in original to the eligibility section. These documents will be preserved by the eligibility section of the University Office, permanently. School / Institute may keep photocopies of the same with the School / Institute for their reference.

8 . RESERVATIONS IN ADMISSIONS

Reservation Policy as prescribed by the Government of Maharashtra from time to time will be applicable for the admissions.

8.1 Territorial Reservation:

As per section 41 (4) of the Maharashtra Private Universities (Establishment and Regulation) Act, 2023, “Out of total approved intake capacity, forty percent of the seats shall be reserved for the students domiciled in the State of Maharashtra.

Note: Forty percent of seats are reserved for Maharashtra. That means sixty percent of seats are open. Those seats can be allotted to anyone including Maharashtra Candidates, as these seats are not reserved for OMS.

8.2 Social or Vertical Reservation:

The Reservations given below shall be applicable only to the Domiciled candidates of the State of Maharashtra. Candidates domicile of other than Maharashtra State, even if belonging to a reserved category as per the reservation policy of their respective states, such candidates will be treated as open category candidates for admission purposes in MIT Art, Design and Technology University .

The percentage of seats reserved for the socially and or educationally backward classes is as follows:

8.3. Horizontal Reservation:

Apart from the above reservations, there will be parallel reservations for Son/Daughter of Defence Service Personnel, Disable candidates and women candidates.

8.3.1. Reservation for sons/daughters of Defence service personnel:

Five percent (5%) seats of the total seats for Maharashtra candidates per course shall be reserved for Children of ex- service personnel who are Domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-1), Children of active service personnel who are Domiciled in Maharashtra State (DEF-2), Children of active service personnel (DEF-3) who are transferred to Maharashtra State but are not domiciled in Maharashtra State, or who are not domiciled in Maharashtra State but their families are stationed in Maharashtra State under the provision of retention of family accommodation at the

last duty station on grounds of children's education provided further that, such candidate should have appeared and passed the HSC examination from a school/college situated in the State of Maharashtra.

- (i) These seats are within the sanctioned intake and are available as State Level seats.
- (ii) A combined single merit list of all eligible DEF1, DEF2 and DEF3 candidates shall be prepared.
- (iii) Candidates claiming these seats shall produce additional documents in Proforma C, D and/or E as applicable.
- (iv) This provision is NOT available to the children of CIVILIAN STAFF who are working /who have worked in the Indian Defence Service.

8.3.2 Reservation for Persons with Disability Candidates:

Five percent (5%) seats of total seats for Maharashtra candidates per course shall be reserved for Candidates having any of the following minimum 40% benchmark disability.

The candidates claiming reservation under this category shall submit the certificates from the authority competent for issuing a such certificate. The certificate (Pro-forma) should clearly state that the extent of disability is not less than 40% (Forty percent) and the disability is permanent in nature.

Note: - Candidates with Disability should note that on admission to degree programme they will not be given any exemptions or additional facilities in the academic activities other than those which may be provided by the respective School / Institute.

8.3.3 Reservations for Orphan Candidates:

One percent (1%) seats of total seats for Maharashtra candidates per course shall be reserved for Orphan Candidates.

8.3.4 Reservation for female candidates:

As per the provisions in Government Resolution No. GEC-1000/ (123/2000)/ Tech. Edu. -1, dated 17th April, 2000, 30% seats shall be reserved for female

candidates. There shall be no reservation for Female candidates under Defence, Persons with Disability and Orphan categories.

This reservation, however, being a horizontal reservation, thirty percent of seats will be reserved within the category. For example, if there are 100 seats available for admission. Then 13 seats will be available for Scheduled caste and 7 seats for Scheduled Tribe and so on. Out of these 13 and 7 seats, 30 percent seats i.e., 4 and 2 will be available for women of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe, respectively. Thus, reservations for women will be 30 percent within the category.

8.4 For claiming the benefit of reservations, the candidate has to submit the following documents:

8.4.1. Territorial Reservation - Domicile Certificate / Birth Certificate / Nationality Certificate

8.4.2. Social or Vertical Reservation:

1. For Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe categories:

- i. Caste Certificate
- ii. Caste Validity Certificate

2. For Vimukta Jati, Nomadic Tribe 1, 2 and 3, Special Backward Class and Other Backward Class

- i. Caste Certificate
- ii. Caste Validity Certificate
- iii. Non-Creamy Layer Certificate valid for the admission year.

8.4.3. Horizontal Reservation - For claiming the reservation of Son/Daughter of Defence Service Personnel and Disable candidates, certificate issued by the concerned authorities is required.

10. RULES FOR PAYMENT OF FEES AND REFUND POLICY

(Academic Year 2024-25)

1. APPLICABILITY AND ENFORCEMENT:

i) It shall be applicable to the candidates who are taking the admission for Undergraduates, Postgraduate, Research scholars, Diploma and certificate programmes in the A.Y. 2024-2025 offered by MIT ADT University.

ii) It shall come into force with immediate effect and shall have regulatory force to extant as well as future grievances over issues and matters covered herein.

2. PAYMENT OF FEES:

a. As per O.118 of the Academic Ordinances, 2021 of MIT ADT University, semester registration by the student at the beginning of each semester is mandatory till she/he completes her/his programme. Students shall pay the full fees of the semester at the time of admission or during the extended time, not more than 10 days, given by the concerned HOI, then only they will be permitted to register for the semester and attend the classes.

There will be two options, available for payment of fees:

1. Programme Fees up to Rs. 1,00,000/- (Up to Rs. One Lakh)- One-time payment has to be made before the commencement of the odd semester of that Academic Year.

2. Programme fees more than Rs. 1,00,000/-(more than Rs. One Lakh)- payment modes are as follows:

1. Payment of fees in two equal installments.

2. Due dates for payment of fees in installments-

i. First installment has to be paid before the commencement of the odd semester of that Academic Year.

ii. Second installment has to be paid before the commencement of the even semester of that Academic Year.

b. Responsibility of the HOIs: If the students are permitted to register without paying the fees or part thereof and attend the classes, then HOIs will be held responsible for the same. Further, HOIs would be required to take a monthly review of the admitted students, the number of students who have paid the fees, and registered students in the prescribed format and submit the same to the office of the Hon'ble Executive President and Vice Chancellor and copy to the Accounts Department.

3. LATE FEES: If any student pays the fees after the due date, then,

a. If paid within 30 days after the due date, a late fee of ₹ 50/- per day will be charged.



- b. If paid after the 30th day but before the 60th day after the due date, the late fee of ₹ 50/- per day for the first 30 days and ₹ 100/- per day after the 30th day will be charged.
- c. If the fee is not paid even after the 60th day of the due date, then the name of the student shall be struck off from the records of the Institute and University with prior permissions of the authorities.
- d. In case, the name of the student is struck off from the records of the Institute and University, then Transfer Certificates or recommendations for admission to the other Institutes/colleges will not be issued to the student or parent.

4. REFUND OF FEES ON CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION:

If a student chooses to withdraw from the program of study or cancels the admission, in which he/she is enrolled, the rules for refund of fees would be as follows (*applicable on yearly program fees):

| 5 | 00% | More than 30 days after the formally notified last date of admission |

Notes: a. In any case, a minimum Rs.15,000/- (Fifteen Thousand) will be deducted from the refundable amount as processing fee.

b. Any amount paid by the student for the purchase of instrument/equipment/gadget or book and stationery purchased from/through the Institute is not refundable.

c. If the student has taken admission by paying a token amount and subsequently applies for cancellation of admission, then the concerned student must pay the deficit amount, if any, of the yearly programme fee after deducting the refund fees percentage as per the case mentioned above, then only the original documents will be returned.

5. LAST DATE OF ADMISSION: For the purpose of Refund of fee on cancellation of Admission, the specified last date of Admission should be considered as **9th July 2024** for Institute of Design and **31st July 2024** for all other Institutes/Schools of the University.

6. INSURANCE: Insurance premium of the student is deposited to the insurance company immediately after the student obtains the provisional admission. Hence, this amount is **NON-REFUNDABLE**.

7. REFUND OF FEE IN OTHER CASES:

i) In case admission is cancelled on account of disciplinary action or violation of Anti ragging Regulations or subsequent abuse or breach of code of conduct or any other Rules and Regulations of the University, no refund is permissible. Only the deposits would be refunded with subsequent deductions as per the recommendations by the Anti ragging committee and the ombudsperson.

ii) In case the admission is cancelled on account of non-eligibility, the refund of fees will be on pro rata basis.

iii) In any other case which is not covered in these rules, or in case of any dispute, the decision of the Vice Chancellor of MIT ADT University would be final and binding.

8. BACKLOG STUDENTS: As per the Examination ordinance 2021, O.302 (4), “Backlog” means the course(s) that a student has not passed or cleared in the Semester-End Examination. It includes theory and performance-based courses.

a. If the student is repeating the year by attending regular classes, then,

i. He/she must pay full fees for the year if the student has failed in more than 50 percent of subjects.

ii. He/she must pay the fees of the semester if the student has failed in 50 percent or less subjects.

b. If the student has completed the term (NO FR) but failed or was not promoted due to minimum CGPA and is not attending the regular classes but appearing for examinations only as a backlog student, then he/she must pay the examination fee as per the rule.

9. FEE STRUCTURE FOR ACADEMIC BREAK STUDENTS:

Students taking a break for any reason, then on re-joining the program, the student will have to pay the fees as per the fee structure applicable for that academic year in which the student re-joins.

10. BANK CHARGES:

1. All bank charges pertaining to inward remittance of the fees, if any, shall be debited to the student’s account.

2. In the event of a cheque/draft return, a sum of ₹ 1000/- besides the bank charges shall be debited to the student’s account.

In case of any dispute regarding this fee policy, the decision of the Vice Chancellor of MIT ADT University would be final & binding.

11. UNIVERSITY HOSTEL ACCOMMODATIONS

Hostel Admission Guidelines & Instructions

11.1 General: MIT ADT University provides accommodation to the students which is a “Home Away from Home” to help students enhance their learning experience and an opportunity to learn from each other. Living together facilitates the understanding of the social and economic context. It also enhances the understanding of the diverse cultures of students from various states of India. It is thus imperative that all residents in the hostel observe discipline which will lead to a good quality of life for all students in the hostel. Detailed information regarding hostels is being provided in the hostel SOP. The rules and regulations are framed to ensure that the hostel property is protected, students staying in the hostel are safe & comfortable in a conducive environment for healthy living and discipline is maintained amongst the inmates. *The Vice-Chancellor reserves the right to amend any of the provisions at any time without assigning any reason.*

11.2 Hostel Facilities Overview: In response to the high demand for hostel facilities and the limited accommodation available within the campus, the management has rented additional buildings in the vicinity of the campus to accommodate maximum students. The provision of hostel staff, including wardens, attendants, and housekeeping staff, is centrally governed by the university hostel department. Furthermore, the university has arranged transport facilities for commuting students between the off-campus hostels to the campus, aligned with the college schedule.

11.4 Hostel Admission Procedure: The accommodation will be allotted on First-cum first serve and school-wise quotas basis. However, preference will be given to first-year students.

- i. Students must fill out the Google form and pay the appropriate fees through the payment gateway to the appropriate stakeholders by using the link given to students.
- ii. **Students must pay the entire annual hostel fee (as applicable) to secure the hostel accommodations. Payment of the hostel fee in instalments is not permitted.**
- iii. **Hostel allocation is valid for one academic year**, and discontinuation of hostel accommodation during the academic year is not permitted.
- iv. As per para (iv) above, while hostel accommodation is provided for one academic year, automatic continuation in subsequent years is not permitted. Students are required to apply annually to indicate their interest in retaining accommodation for the following academic year.
- v. Hostel admission may be denied to students involved in acts of indiscipline.
- vi. Only final-year students can apply for check-out from the hostel for their internship/placement before the last semester. In this case, the fee calculation will be made monthly. Applicants must submit a written application with the reasons for hostel check-out along with supporting documents duly signed by the Academic Head.

The accommodation will be allotted on First-cum first serve and school-wise quotas basis. However, preference will be given to first-year students.

- vii. Students must fill out the Google form and pay the appropriate fees through the payment gateway to the appropriate stakeholders by using the link given to students.

11.5 Hostel Fees Structure:

- i. The fees subscribed cover 10 months out of the entire academic year. If a student stays for more than 10 months for any reason, additional fees will be charged monthly.
 - ii. The hostel fees encompass accommodation charges, mess charges, and transport charges for outside campus hostels, all of which are mandatory.
 - iii. The hostel fee structure is dynamic and subject to review annually by the management.

11.6 Hostel Cancellation & Refund Procedure:

Any cancellation of the hostel and subsequent refund shall be applicable as per Cancellation and the refund policy. **[Hence, it is imperative for students to thoroughly read and understand the cancellation and refund policy to](#)**

avoid any misunderstandings and ensure a smooth cancellation process.

- i. Students are required to submit the hostel cancellation form and hostel check-out form, along with any other necessary documents along with bank details to the hostel office.
- ii. Any refund amount calculated according to the cancellation/refund policy will be transferred to the student's bank account or will be adjusted in the program fees upon the student's request.
- iii. If the student has paid the applicable hostel fees but is not allotted a hostel room due to non-availability, in this case, the total hostel fees paid will be refunded or may be adjusted in the program fees on the student's request.
- iv. If students cancel their hostel accommodation for any reason, the fee for food and transport for the non-staying period will be waived.
- v. If students fail to pay the hostel's outstanding fees before the due date set by the hostel authority, a late fine of ₹ 50/- per day will be charged.
- vi. Students seeking an education loan should pay a minimum of ₹ 50,000/-. The balance hostel fee shall be paid within one month of the admission.
- vii. The percentage of refund will be calculated from the date on which the cancellation request is received, with reference to the commencement of the academic year.
- viii. If the student is rusticated from the institute, he/ she will be rusticated from the hostel also and the hostel fees will NOT be refunded.
- ix. The revised cancellation policy will be informed to the schools as and when it is revised.

13. Scholarship/ Concession for Economically Weaker Sections

13.1 General:

Concession in fee for the Student from Economically Weaker Section (EWS): The Government of Maharashtra has issued GR No. Misc-2022/ pk.91/ vishi-4, dt. 22.06.2023, providing 50% (fifty percent) concession / scholarship in total fees to 10% (ten percent) students as per merit, belonging to the Economically Weaker Section, as per Govt norms, without considering cast or category, admitted in self-financed universities. This concession is to be given for completing the program. Students admitted in 2023-24 onward will be entitled for the concession/Scholarship.

The students from Maharashtra, whose total family income is less than Rs. 8,00,000/- (Rs. Eight Lakhs), per year are eligible to get the EWS Concession / Scholarship

13.2 Procedure for merit list preparation:

The process of giving Concession/Scholarship is to be implemented at the time of admission and a report of the same, including the details of the students to whom Concession is given, is to be submitted to the Government of Maharashtra within one month from the last date of admission.

13.2.1 Distribution of seats for various entrance exams:

Accordingly, it is communicated to all the Deans and Directors that the same be brought to the notice of Students and Parents coming for Admission and applications be accepted from the eligible students at the time of admission in the prescribed format, with specific information to the student that he will be eligible to get the Concession if he satisfies the requirements of Merit and EWS.

After Admissions are completed, in case of Schools where admissions are given based on JEE and MH-CET, program-wise two separate Merit Lists of the admitted students be prepared based on the students who appeared for JEE and MH-CET. In the case of schools, where admissions are given based on different CETs, different merit Lists as per their CETs be prepared. For any programs where admissions are given without CET, a merit list be prepared on marks obtained at 12th standard.

Statement of the program wise list specifying the qualifying examination (MH-CET, JEE, NEET, NATA, 12th std., Diploma, Graduation) is attached herewith as Annexure-A. All School will prepare the Merit Lists accordingly.

While calculating the 10% eligible students for Concession / Scholarship, 50% be taken from JEE list and 50% from the MH-CET list, where admissions are given based on JEE and MH-CET and in case of other Schools Lists as per their CETs. Then, documents be called from the students, who have not submitted at the time of admission, giving four days' time to submit the documents to prove their entitlement for EWS. A Committee be constituted in the School under the Chairmanship of the Dean/Director for scrutiny of documents. Based on the report of the Committee, lists of students eligible for EWS Concession/ Scholarship (50% from JEE List and 50% from MHT-CET List) be prepared and submitted to the Registrar's office.

While working out the 10% or 50%, mentioned above, in the case of decimal, 0.51 be rounded off to the next integer and up to 0.50 be rounded off to the previous integer.

Report of the Scrutiny Committee with specific recommendations of the Director of the School about the eligibility of the student for EWS be submitted to Registrar Office.

Registrar's Office then will consolidate the reports received from various schools, confirm that 10% of students of the total admissions in the University are getting the EWS Concession/Scholarship and place the same for approval before the Executive President.

After approval from the Executive President, lists of the students who have got the EWS Concession/Scholarship, be displayed on the notice board of the concerned school and a copy of the same be given to Accounts Department.

The student and account section of the concerned school will make the entries of the same in their record against the names of respective students and only 50% of the total fees be accepted from the concerned students.

13.3 Proof of income is to be verified from-

Compulsory documents:

1. For Reserved Category candidate – Income certificate issued by Tahasildar. (OR)
2. For Non-Reserved Category candidate – EWS certificate issued by Tahasildar.

In addition to above any one or more, as the case may be –

1. If anyone in the family is in Service, Form No. 16 is to be verified.
2. If there is a Business of the family, the Income Tax, GST paid etc to be verified.
3. If the family owns the land, then 7/12 extracts and 8-A extracts to be verified.
4. If anybody in the family is retired, then a certificate issued by the bank or bank statement, income tax returns to be verified.
5. Income from any other source (investments, dividends etc.) be verified.
